

Point #3: How the Bible Describes Hell

Eternal Punishment and Torment

Final and Inescapable: Hell is presented as a final destination from which there is no return or escape, a grave warning about the consequences of rejecting God.

No Second Chances: The Bible indicates that death is a one-time event followed by judgment, and there are no opportunities for repentance or reconciliation after death.

Eternal Torment: Passages like Matthew 25:46 describe it as "eternal punishment," a concept supported by verses in Revelation about "eternal torment" and no rest "day or night".

Descriptions of Torment

A Place of Fire and Anguish: Hell is described as a "furnace of conscious torment" and a place of "excruciating misery" where the fire "never goes out" and the "worm does not die".

Anguish and Despair: The eternal nature of the torment means that despair can only increase over time, with no hope of it ever ending.

Separation From God: Hell is a state of being separated from the presence of God, who is the source of Romans 8:32 is a powerful verse that assures believers of God's complete provision based on the supreme sacrifice of His Son.

Commentators

Rom 8:32 emphasizes that this verse uses an argument from the greater to the lesser: if God gave His most precious gift, He will certainly provide everything else needed for salvation and spiritual welfare.

Key Themes and Interpretations

The Logic of Heaven (Greater to Lesser): The central argument is that the sacrifice of Jesus was the greatest act of love and giving possible. If God was willing to do the hardest and costliest thing (give His own Son), it is illogical to think He would withhold any "lesser" good or necessary thing from those for whom Christ died. This provides immense assurance of salvation and future provision, all comfort, peace, and life. In hell, there is no mediator, only God's wrath, leading to increasing despair.

All we have to do is truly want to be saved. not to be cast into the eternal fire.

Philippians 2:13 (AMPC)

[Not in your own strength] for it is God Who is all the while effectually at work in you [energizing and creating in you the power and desire], both to will and to work for His good pleasure and satisfaction and delight.
